CODE OF CONDUCT

OF THE AIR AND SPACE SCHOOL (EAE)

In accordance with Decree 2018-1158 of 14 December 2018, as amended, relating to the Air and Space School, In accordance with Resolution No. 2019-09.13 relating to the amended general internal regulations,

"The Air and Space School, rooted in tradition, carried by the wings of command and focused on innovation in an aerospace environment."

1/ Our values

They are those of the Air and Space Force: respect, integrity, sense of service and excellence. The main purpose of the Air and Space Academy is to train all Air Force officers. Around 700 officers are trained each year. As a command school, it prepares future military leaders to serve both at home and in the field, with discernment and a keen sense of responsibility. It has welcomed generations of officers inspired by its commitments:

Serve, fight, train, innovate, learn, convince, face up to challenges.

2/ The site

The EAE is located at Salon-de-Provence Air Base 701, a military site where various Air and Space Force missions are prepared and carried out. You are therefore informed that you will be subject to an administrative investigation for intelligence and security purposes (Ministerial Instruction No. 900 of 15 March 2021). Depending on the outcome of this administrative investigation and the position taken by the military authorities, the EAE reserves the right to refuse you access at any time. The military authority is not required to justify its decision.

Access is subject to the military zone protection regime in accordance with the provisions of Articles R. 2361 et seq. of the Defence Code. It is therefore regulated and subject to control in accordance with the regulations in force within the Ministry of the Armed Forces.

3/ What the EAE expects from its visitors

All participants in an event organised on the premises of the Air and Space School must comply with our code of conduct.

The purpose of this charter is to establish a friendly and safe environment that protects participants from any inappropriate, unsuitable or dangerous behaviour, whether towards staff or the property of the AAE and the EAE.

- The premises and equipment made available to staff, users and third parties remain the sole property of the State or the establishment. They are provided in their current condition and must be returned in the same condition. Any damage resulting from improper use may result in legal action against the person(s) responsible.
- In accordance with the provisions of Articles R. 3512-2 to 9 of the Public Health Code, smoking and vaping are prohibited in public places, enclosed and covered premises open to the public or constituting workplaces;
- In accordance with the terms of instruction no. 2405/DEF/CEMAAE/C/PERS of 14 May 2024 and pursuant to the directives of the CEMAAE by letter no. 228/ARM/CEMAAE of 14 May 2024, it is prohibited to arrive under the influence of alcohol or to consume alcohol to excess (strong alcoholic beverages are prohibited) during the event and/or to consume illegal substances on site. In order to ensure the safety of all participants, it is therefore recommended that individual breathalyser tests be provided at the end of the event;
- It is prohibited to harass EAE staff, staff of a company providing services on site or visitors, morally or sexually, during the events or afterwards;
- Abusive, racist, xenophobic or sexist comments are strictly prohibited.

You are asked to:

- Be punctual in order to respect the schedule announced in advance. The quality of your welcome on site depends on it.
- Park your vehicle in the designated areas provided for this purpose. Any vehicle parked illegally, obstructing the free movement of emergency and service vehicles, may be removed;
- To comply with general safety instructions, in particular evacuation instructions in the event of a fire;
- Do not take photographs or videos without the permission of EAE staff (ask the Communications and External Relations Office).
- To comply with the health regulations in force at the time of the event;
- Comply with EAE's sustainable development and social responsibility policy. This means disposing of waste in the appropriate bins, turning off lights and closing water taps.
- Do not connect your personal vehicle to the electric charging stations reserved for military vehicles.

Finally, EAE management has full authority over the event and may decide to exclude any participant whose attitude and/or behaviour is inappropriate and/or does not comply with the rules set out above.
